Conservation Congress Hearing

Chuck Bronte from the US Game & Wildlife Service- Chuck gave a detailed list of people and departments involved in their work. Research on the natural Reproduction of Chinook and Steelhead. They are currently in the process of purchasing their 5th Trailer. Michigan is the process of purchasing their own auto-tagging trailer. Notated that t hey will need all this equipment as the plan to tag Steelhead, Chinook ad Coho. 9.5 million fish auto tagged and once Cohos are adding that number will jump another 3 million Fish tagged yearly. Collection is done from April to mid-September. They look at every piece of data in front of them. Ear bones, Scales, Contaminants, info on the coded wire tag and notation of adipose clip. In Michigan waters from the 2018 Sport Catch 64% of age 2 fish caught were from wild reproduction. Wilder or naturally reproducing fish are caught in open waters. It has been notated that survival of stocked Chinook into lake Michigan comes from the ones stocked on the Wisconsin side of the lake. He also notated Lake Trout caught and % of natural reproduction but I did not catch that number.

Brad Eggold-WDNR- Brad gave the link address for the August 30, 2022, Salmon and Trout Informational meeting that was held. Discussed were both long- and short-term goals and what information was used to develop the criteria for each category. He presented slides with Alewife Biomass, Alewife Abundance, Alewife Age Structure, Predator Prey ratios for Chinook. He presented slides with the average weight of age 3 female Chinooks from the fall weir and harbor surveys from all states. Most interesting was the slide on Comments on stocking numbers by species. They only received 14 emails about the stocking of fish. And my personal thoughts were that it was shore fisherman who responded more that open water fisherman (made by seeing the number of asks for increases). For increases Steelhead, Brown Trout and Brook trout had the most request to increase stocking. The largest ask to not change the current stocking plan was for Chinook and had 1 vote to decrease stocking. The only other notable was the ask to increase, one angler asked to increase lake trout stocking and 1 asked to decrease stocking of lake Trout. Brad gave an update on the completed, in process items and items not started initiatives program for 2019. Reviewed current and newly added Initiatives. Reviewed the 2020 – 2022 Stocking Plan.

Brad also reviewed net pens and electronic reporting. Funding for covid related losses (Charters). He spoke briefly about the Pink and Pinook Salmon showing up in Lake Michigan. Cost of stocking fish. Notably that Seaforellen and less expensive to stock that German Browns are.

Titus Seilheimer- UWM - Reviewed Data Buoys locations. Invasive weeds, along with River restoration projects, Yellow Perch increases and Wild Rice Restoration projects.

Ryan Propsom – WDNR Conservation Warden – Ryan spoke about that there will be a stricter enforcement on all Charter and Guides as well as Commercial Fisherman to report their catch asap. Tickets will be given.

Discussion on a Group Resolution to Conservation Congress for a Sport Fishing Board as advocates for the Sport Fisherman. Lynn made the motion to create a Sport Fishing Board as advocates for the Sport Fisherman. 2nd by Rich Jones. All in Favor. None Opposed. Motion Carried.



Pink salmon

Oncorhynchus gorbuscha

Pink salmon, also called "humpies," are the smallest of the Pacific salmon. They are usually found in streams and rivers that connect directly to salt water (with no lakes in between). But, pink salmon sometimes "stray" and can be seen spawning in creeks that you wouldn't expect! If you see a salmon, here's some tips to use to determine whether or not it's a pink salmon...



Identification characteristics:

- Rare in Lake Washington Watershed
- Oval-shaped black spots on back and caudal fin
- Males have very large humpback
- · Tail is very forked

Range in length from 14 to 30 inches

Spawn timing:

· August through October only in ODD-numbered years in our area

Coho salmon Oncorhynchus kisutch

Coho salmon, also called "silvers" or "silver salmon," are another species of Pacific Salmon found in King County. Coho often spawn in the smaller streams and don't tend to spawn in the larger rivers like <u>Chinook</u>. Because spawning coho can be red in color, similar in size, and spawn or travel though the same streams, they can sometimes be confused with <u>sockeye</u>. If you see a salmon, here's some tips to use to determine whether or not it's a coho...

Identification characteristics:

- Back and head dark bluish-green
- Lower sides brilliant red to wine color
- Gill cover reddish
- Spots on back and UPPER lobe of tail fin only
- Lower gum line is light colored
 Range in length from 17 to 38 inches

Spawn timing:

Mid-October through early January

Chinook

Jaw - dark mouth and black gums at the base of its large, sharp teeth. Immature Chinook are known as a "blackmouth."



Tail - both the upper and lower lobes of the tail are covered with spots and silver is prominent.



Coho

Jaw - Jaw- mouth is white and the gum line is almost white, but the tongue may be black. The medium-sized teeth are sharp.



Tail - has just a few scattered spots, usually on the upper lobe, with silver streaks. Base of tail is wide.



Pink

Jaw - mouth of a pink is white, but the gums and tongue are black, as they are in a Chinook. It does not have "teeth" on its tongue.



Tail - is covered with large oval spots. It does not have silver on the tail. The scales are very small compared to other salmon.





Jaw - The chinook has a dark mouth and black gums at the base of its teeth. Immature chinook are known

Tail - Both the upper and lower lobes of the tail are covered with spots and silver is prominent.



Pink

Coho
Jaw - The mouth is white and the gum line is almost white, but the tongue may be black. The teeth are

sharp and strong.

Tail – The coho tail has just a few scattered spots, usually on the upper lobe, with silver streaks. It has a wide caudal peduncle.

Jaw – The mouth of a pink is white, but the gums and tongue are black, as they are in a chinook. It does not have "teeth" on its tongue.

Tail – The pink salmon tail is covered with large oval spots. It does not have silver on the tail. The scales are very small compared to other salmon of























peduncle is narrow.

Sockeye
Jaw – The mouth is white and the gum line is white.
The lips are fleshy. The teeth are small and well developed in both jaws. There are no teeth on the base of the tongue.

Tail – There are no spots on the tail.

Chum
Jaw – The mouth is white and the gum line is white, but the tongue may be black. The lips are fleshy with well developed teeth in both jaws, but there are no teeth on the base of the tongue.

Tail – The tail has no spots, but does have silver streaks covering about half of the fin. The caudal
